Prof. Dr. Gianrico Spagnuolo received his D.D.S. degree from the University of Naples "Federico II", where he also completed a Ph.D. in Dental Materials Biotechnology and a postgraduate program in Oral Surgery.

He has served as Visiting Assistant Professor and Adjunct Scientist at the Dental School of the University of Regensburg (Germany). Currently, he holds the position of Visiting Professor of Operative Dentistry at I. M. Sechenov First Moscow State Medical University – Institute of Dentistry (Russia), and at the School of Dentistry, College of Dental Medicine, Kaohsiung Medical University (Taiwan).

Prof. Spagnuolo is a Professor at the School of Dentistry of the University of Naples "Federico II", where he also serves as Director of the Master's Degree Program in Endodontics and Restorative Dentistry.

His research interests focus on the interactions between cells, tissues, and dental materials at both the molecular and clinical levels. In recent years, he has developed a strong interest in stem cell research, particularly in dental-derived mesenchymal stem cells (MSCs), resulting in high-impact publications and successful acquisition of competitive research grants.

He has held leadership roles within the International Association for Dental Research (IADR), serving as Councilor, Vice-President, and President of the Stem Cell Biology Group. He is currently President-Elect of the Continental European Division of IADR and a Board Member of the Pan European Region of IADR.

To date, Prof. Spagnuolo has authored approximately 230 articles in international, peer-reviewed journals. He has an h-index of 45 and over 6,000 citations (source: Scopus).
